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12 NCAC 10B .2005 MINIMUM TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

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Subchapter.

- (a) A Sheriff or Department Head may use a lesson plan developed by the North Carolina Justice Academy or a lesson plan for any of the topic areas developed by another entity. The Sheriff or Department Head may also use a lesson plan developed by a certified instructor, provided that the instructor develops the lesson plan in accordance with the Instructional Systems Development model as taught in Criminal Justice Instructor Training and as described in 12 NCAC 09B .0209. Lesson plans shall be designed to be delivered in hourly increments. A student who completes the training shall receive the number of credits that correspond to the number of hours assigned to the course, regardless of the amount of time the student spends completing the course, where each hour of instruction shall be worth one credit (e.g., "Legal Update" is designed to be delivered in four hours and will yield four credits). With the exception of Firearms Training and Requalification, successful completion of training shall be demonstrated by passing tests as developed by the delivering agency or as written by the North Carolina Justice Academy. A written test comprised of at least five questions per hour of training shall be developed by the delivering agency, or the agency may use the written test developed by the North Carolina Justice Academy, for each in-service training topic. A student shall pass each test by achieving 70 percent correct answers. Firearms Training and Requalification shall be demonstrated qualification with a firearm as set out in Section .2100 of this

1	12 NCAC 10B .0510 IS PROPOSED TO BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:
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3	12 NCAC 10B .0510 CERTIFICATION AND TRAINING FOR SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS
4	(a) The School Resource Officer training course for law enforcement officers shall provide the trainee with the skills
5	and knowledge to perform in the capacity of a School Resource Officer. The course shall be for a period of 40 hours.
6	School Resource Officer (SRO) is defined as any law enforcement officer assigned to one or more public schools
7	within a public school unit, who works in a school at least 20 hours per week for more than 12 weeks per calendar
8	year to assist with all of the following:
9	(1) School safety;
10	(2) School security;
11	(3) Emergency preparedness;
12	(4) Emergency response; and,
13	(5) Any additional responsibilities related to school safety or security assigned by the officer's employer
14	while the officer is acting as a School Resource Officer.
15	These requirements shall be consistent with any written memorandum of understanding between the public school
16	unit and the law enforcement agency governing the School Resource Officer.
17	(b) The "School Resource Officer Training" course published by the North Carolina Justice Academy shall be used

29	(b) Deputy Sheriffs assigned by their agency to perform duties as a School Resource Officer shall:
30	(1) have been issued general certification by the North Carolina Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards
31	Commission as a deputy sheriff; and
32	(2) have until December 31, 2020 to complete the Basic School Resource Officer training course if they
33	are acting in the capacity of a School Resource Officer between January 1, 2019 and December 31, 2019.
34	Any officer assigned as a School Resource Officer effective 1/01/2020 or later shall complete the "Basic
35	School Resource Officer Training" course pursuant to Paragraph (f) of this Rule, within one year after
36	being assigned as a School Resource Officer. Deputy Sheriffs who previously completed the training
37	pursuant to Paragraph (f) of this Rule and who have been continually assigned as an SRO pursuant to

1	Paragraph (a) of this Rule shall be credited with completion of the "Basic School Resource Officer
2	Training" course.
3	(c) A deputy sheriff assigned to one or more public schools within a public school unit, who works in a school at
4	least 20 hours per week for more than 12 weeks per calendar year and who has not completed the initial training as
5	established by Paragraph (f) of this Rule shall not work in a school as a School Resource Officer until the officer has
6	completed the initial training as established by Paragraph (f) of this Rule.
7	(d) The agency head shall submit to the Sheriffs' Standards Division a Form F-20 Commission School Resource
8	Officer Assignment Form for the person(s) selected to act as a School Resource Officer for the agency. The Form F-
9	20 is located on the agency's website: https://ncdoj.gov and must be completed in its entirety.
10	(e) The term of certification as a School Resource Officer is indefinite, provided the School Resource Officer
11	completes during each calendar year a minimum of one hour of School Resource Officer refresher training authored
12	by North Carolina Justice Academy. For School Resource Officers who complete the basic SRO training
13	requirement in 2020 or earlier, this requirement becomes effective January 1, 2021. Otherwise, this requirement
14	becomes effective the year following the officer's successful completion of the Basic School Resource Officer
15	Training course. A certified School Resource Officer who has not completed the refresher training during a calendar
16	year as established by this section shall not work in a school as a School Resource Officer until the officer has
17	completed the required refresher training as established by this Section.
18	Deputy Sheriffs assigned by their agency to perform duties as a School Resource Officer shall:
19	(1) have been issued general certification by the NC Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards
20	Commission as a law enforcement officer; and
21	(2) have completed, or complete within one year after being assigned as a School Resource Officer,
22	the School Resource Officer the "School Resource Officer Training" course pursuant to Paragraph
23	(b) of this Rule.
24	(f) The School Resource Officer training course for deputy sheriffs shall provide the trainee with the skills and
25	knowledge to perform in the capacity of a School Resource Officer. The "Basic School Resource Officer Training"
26	course authored by the North Carolina Justice Academy shall be used as the curriculum for this training course.
