"Public Comment" is defined by NCGS 150B-21.3A(a)(5) as a written objection to all or part of a rule. Additionally, pursuant to NCGS 150B-21.3A(c)(2), in order for the Rules Review Commission to determine whether the public comment has merit, the public comment must address the specific substance of the rule and address any of the standards of Commission review, as set forth in NCGS 150B-21.9(a).

If approved, this change would become effective November 1, 2023

Procedure for Subjecting a Proposed Rule to Legislative Review:

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If an objection is not resolved prior to the adoption of the rule, a person may also submit written objections to the Rules Review Commission. If the Rules Review Commission receives written and signed objections in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.3(b2) from 10 or more persons clearly requesting review by the legislature and the Rules Review Commission approves the rule, the rule will become effective as provided in G.S. 150B-21.3(b1). The Commission will receive written objections until 5:00 p.m. on the day following the day the Commission approves the rule. The Commission will receive those objections by mail, delivery service, hand delivery, or facsimile transmission. 4 (a) Applicants for detention officer certification with prior detention or correctional officer experience who have been 5 employed and certified as a detention or correctional officer may seek a training waiver evaluation pursuant to this

6 Section.

7 (b) The Division shall use the following to evaluate a detention officer's training and experience to grant a training8 waiver:

- 9 (1) Persons who separated from a detention officer position during the probationary period after 10 completion of a commission-certified Detention Officer Certification Course and who have been 11 separated from a detention officer position for more than one year shall complete a subsequent 12 commission-certified Detention Officer Certification Course in its entirety and pass the State 13 Comprehensive Examination within the 12 month probationary period as set forth in Rule .0602(a) 14 of this Section.
- 15 (2) Persons who separated from a detention officer position during their probationary period after 16 completion of a commission-certified Detention Officer Certification Course and who have been 17 separated from a detention officer position for one year or less shall serve the remainder of the initial 18 probationary period in accordance with G.S. 17E-7(b), but need not complete an additional training 19 program.
- 20(3)Persons who separated from a detention officer position during the probationary period without21completion of a commission-certified Detention Officer Certification Course, or whose certification22was suspended pursuant to Rule .0204(b)(1) of this Subchapter and who have remained separated23or suspended for over one year shall complete a commission-certified Detention Officer24Certification Course in its entirety and pass the State Comprehensive Examination, and shall be25allowed a 12 month probationary period as prescribed in Rule .0602(a) of this Section.
- 26(4)Persons holding General Justice Officer Certification as a detention officer pursuant to 12 NCAC2710B .0404 who completed a commission-certified Detention Officer Certification Course and who28separated from a detention officer position for more than one year shall complete a subsequent29commission-certified Detention Officer Certification Course in its entirety and pass the State30Comprehensive Examination within the 12 month probationary period as prescribed in Rule31.0602(a) of this Section.
