

## CAN YOU CHALLENGE BLET?

<p>Do you have at least 2 years full-time experience as sworn law enforcement officer either in North Carolina or with a Federal or Out-of-State Agency?</p> <p>Note: Military Law Enforcement is not credited.</p>	<p>Yes.</p> <p>You will need to provide documentation of your prior service as well as documentation that such service meets the definition of sworn law enforcement position.</p>
<p>Did you hold certification with the relevant Peace Officer's Standards and Training agency either in North Carolina, another state, or federal agency?</p>	<p>Yes.</p> <p>You will need to provide documentation of this certification.</p>
<p>Did you hold general powers of arrest either in North Carolina or with a Federal or Out-of-State Agency?</p>	<p>Yes.</p> <p>You will need to provide documentation that your service meets the definition of general powers of arrest.</p>
<p>If you answered YES to the above questions, you have a choice between:</p>	
<p><b><u>Option 1</u></b></p> <p>Within the twelve month probationary period, challenge the BLET state examination and undergo a skills assessment. The applicant must score a minimum of 70% to successfully complete the state examination. The skills assessment consists of five areas: First Responder; Firearms; Law Enforcement Driver Training; Officer Health &amp; Wellness (Physical Fitness); and Compliance &amp; Control Tactics. The applicant must demonstrate satisfactory knowledge of each skills related activity before an appropriate instructor certified</p>	<p><b><u>Option 2</u></b></p> <p>Enroll in and successfully complete a Basic Law Enforcement (BLET) course offering in its entirety.</p>
