5. If you assumed a leadership role within the volunteer activity, please be sure to include it.

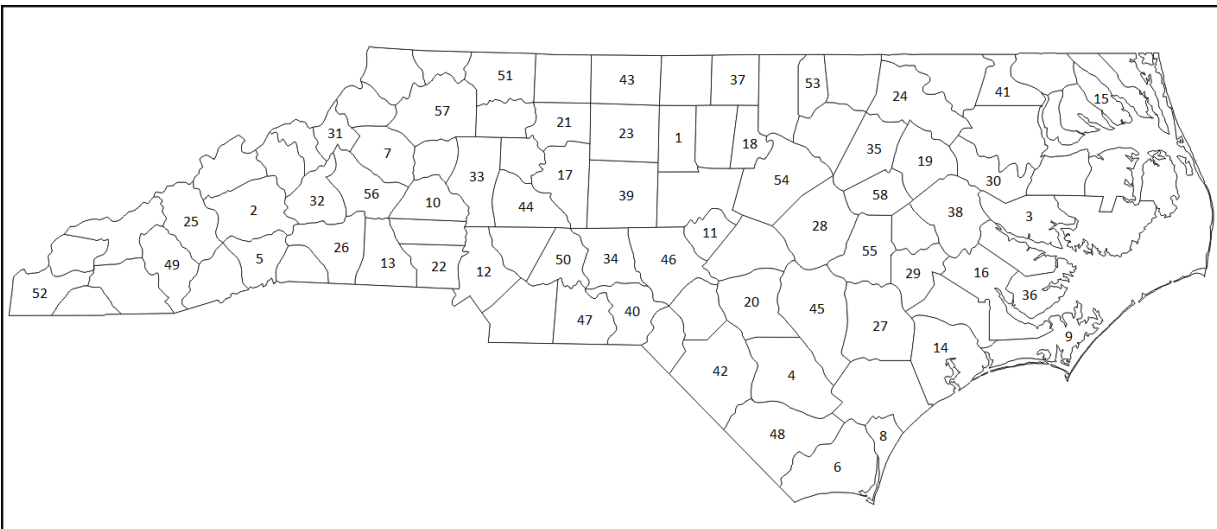

Eligible Criminal Justice Professions

Fellows must obtain and maintain employment one of the following eligible criminal justice professions for four (4) years upon graduation to be eligible for loan forgiveness. This list is not exhaustive and simply represents broad examples of eligible professions. If you have any questions about whether a criminal justice profession that you are interested would fall under one of the listed eligible criminal justice professions, please email cjfellows@ncdoj.gov.

- State and local sworn law enforcement
 - State police officers, city/municipal police officers, metro police officers, highway patrol troopers, detectives, gang officers, K-9 officers
- State correctional officers
 - Prison correctional officers, prison housing unit managers, prison program directors, wardens
- State juvenile justice officers
- Other correctional officers maintained by local governments, and juvenile justice agencies
- Sworn Sheriffs and Deputy Sheriffs
 - Sheriffs, Deputy Sheriffs, bailiffs
- Detention officers
 - County detention officers/jailers
- Telecommunicators under the direct supervision of a law enforcement agency
 - Telecommunicators/dispatchers working for a police department or sheriff office
