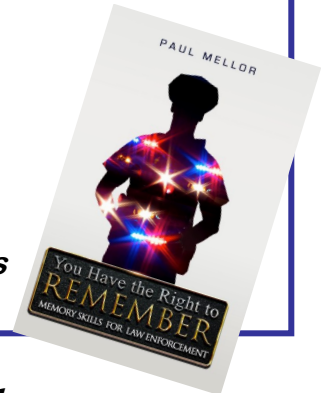

GOAL: To show how a trained memory helps in all aspects of law enforcement.

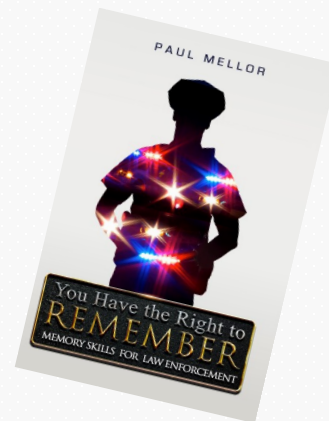
To shred the myth that memory cannot be improved. It can; easily and effectively.

0830 **Memory Magic**

1000 **Courtroom Confidence without Notes**

Techniques on preparing a case for court without notes. Participants will gain the knowledge on remembering detailed information from their notes to confidently speak without them. Several examples and demonstrations will be presented.

1100 **Remembering License Plate Numbers and Codes**

Understanding and applying the phonetic alphabet to remembering numbers. The use of coding letters to numbers enables each attendee to remember a 30-digit number. Knowing this system shows the ease and success rate in recalling license plate numbers, phone numbers, and codes.

1300 **Beating Absent-mindedness**

Coping in a fast paced world, attendees will learn the lessons on how to beat absent-mindedness. Through the use of imagery and success principals, participants will be able to master their mind so they'll never forget. Misplaced glasses, lost keys, and "*I know it's here somewhere*" statements will be a thing of the past.

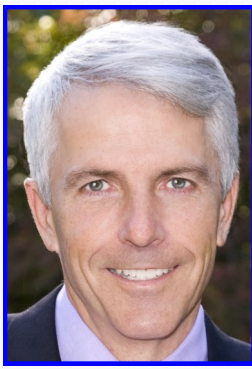
1500 **How to Remember Names and Faces**
