

Military Service Members – Become certified as a NC law enforcement officer!



Have you...



- ...Maintained a clean criminal record?***
- ...Been awarded a military law enforcement MOS?***
- ...Completed a military law enforcement training program?***
- ...Completed 2 years full-time assignment in military law enforcement?***

If you meet the above requirements and are interested in becoming a certified law enforcement officer in NC, please complete the Form F-21, and submit it to either the Criminal Justice or Sheriffs' Standards Division. The form is available [here](#).

Upon receipt of your application, the respective Standards Division will determine within thirty (30) days if you meet the requirements of *NC Senate Bill 761 (NCGS 93B-15.1)*, as well as *12 NCAC 09B .0701* to receive credit for military training and experience.

If the Standards Division determines that you meet these requirements, you will be granted limited enrollment in the NC Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) program. As a military trained individual, you will be granted credit for 142 hours of training! Once enrollment is authorized you must complete, within 12 months, the 474 required hours in any approved BLET delivery throughout the state of NC; pass the Police Officer Physical Abilities Test (POPAT) and the state comprehensive written exam.

Upon completion of the required training and testing, you are eligible to apply for certification through any of the 550+ law enforcement agencies regulated by the Criminal Justice and Sheriffs' Standards Commissions!

****For Sheriffs' Standards applicants: you may be sworn and work as a Deputy Sheriff during the 12-month training period following Standards Division enrollment approval. For information, contact Sheriffs' Standards Division at (919) 779-8213****
